Getting Around Calgary				
Public Transportation: Calgary Transit		Taxi or ridesharing (paid for services)		
To get around the city you have two choices with <u>Calgary Transit</u> : By train: Commonly known as the <u>CTrain (LRT)</u> . It has two main lines - a red line that runs north to south and a blue line that runs east to west. The CTrain is free in downtown called the free fair zone. The free fair zone is along Seventh avenue in downtown Calgary. As long as you get off the train before leaving downtown, no fare is required. Glenbow College is within this free fair zone. City of Calgary's "The Newcomers Guide to Calgary" includes a Map of the <u>CTrain route</u> . By bus: Bus network in Calgary is extensive and connects with the CTrain line. To find your route, you can visit Calgary Transit or download the Calgary Transit app. The app enables you to select your origin and destination to find where you are going and provides you all the details of the journey. Paper copies of printed schedules can be picked up from any convenience store or printed		 Available all around the city and are regulated by The City of Calgary. Just like in other major cities, taxis can accept rides that are street hailed or booked ahead of time (by phone, website or app). Taxis charge a rate that is capped at a maximum regulated amount. Ridesharing companies can arrange rides with passengers or customers only through an app. Ridesharing companies charge unregulated rates not subject to a maximum amount. Things to do before your Ride: Look for a taxi plate on the rear bumper to ensure you are taking a licensed taxi. Be aware of the company, vehicle colour and phone number in case you need to track down lost items or share a compliment or concern about your ride. You can pay your taxi fare by cash, credit or debit cards.
